Third Concept in Attachment Theory

- ❖ Separation produces extreme distress
- ❑ Three States of Distress
 - Protest
 - Despair
 - Detachment



Fourth Concept in Attachment Theory

- ❖ There are significant long term adverse effects on a child as a result of separation.
- Study of 44 thieves



Fifth Concept of Attachment Theory

- ❖ Theory emphasizes the role of mother in child's development, where father plays the second fiddle to mothering.
- Mother/child
- Michael Rutter- Father of child psychology
